Frederick Herzberg The hygiene motivation theory Thinker 001 Frederick Herzberg (1923-2000) was a US clinical psychologist who later became Professor of Management at Utah University His "overriding interest in mental health" stemmed from his belief that "mental health is the core issue of our times" This was prompted by his posting to the Dachau

by Frederick Herzberg When Frederick Herzberg researched the sources of employee motivation during the 1950s and 1960s, he discovered a dichotomy that still intrigues (and baffles) managers: The things that make people satisfied and motivated on the job are different in kind from the things that make them dissatisfied

### **Herzberg's Motivation- Hygiene Theory Applied to High ...**

Herzberg (1971) had conducted a study with two hundred engineers and accountants in the state of Pittsburgh, then modeled the basis of his motivation-hygiene theory In the study, Herzberg and his friends had questioned the employees about events at work which had either led to remarkable improvement or decrease in their level of job satisfaction
