Langston Hughes Biography

Langston Hughes was a prolific writer In the forty-odd years between his first book in 1926 and his death in 1967, he devoted his life to writing and lecturing He wrote sixteen books of poems, two novels, three collections of short stories, four volumes of "editorial" and
