What is student engagement? Interest in student engagement has grown over the past two decades, although there is substantial variation in how it has been defined and measured
Early studies defined student engagement primarily by observable behaviors such as participation and time on task (Brophy 1983; Natriello 1984)

Student engagement is a function of both the individual and the construct It varies in intensity and duration For example, a student may feel very engaged one semester but not so much the next; another student might enjoy some of his or her classes but be bored in others Student engagement is increasingly viewed as one of the keys to
