6 Writing Quality Learning Objectives - Duke University

- Learning objectives should be SMART (specific, measurable, acceptable to the instructor, realistic to achieve, and time-bound with a deadline) - Include complex or higher-order learning objectives when they are appropriate

Assessment measures the learning objectives 1 Design evaluation activities to measure the performance of the learning objectives If you can't, modify the learning objectives 2 Develop the measurement criteria and methods (what questions best determine learned performance) based on what is stated in the learning objectives 3

Writing Learning Objectives for Nursing A learning objective is a statement which explains a specific goal that you want to achieve in your future learning The learning objective should be something that you can measure by doing specific activities within a definite time frame Use the SMART framework when you are writing your learning

Writing SMART Objectives To use an objective to monitor your progress, you need to write it as a SMART objective A SMART objective is: 1 Specific:

- Objectives should provide the “who” and “what” of program activities
- Use only one action verb since objectives with more than one verb

How to Write Program Objectives/Outcomes Objectives Goals and Objectives are similar in that they describe the intended purposes and expected results of teaching activities and establish the foundation for assessment Goals are statements about general aims or purposes of education that are broad, long-range intended outcomes and concepts; eg, “clear

Guidelines for writing measurable SLOs When writing (or reviewing) SLOs, consider the following guidelines and expectations: Write student learning outcomes in measurable language Use the SMART model to write measurable outcomes Refer to the Action Words for Bloom’s Taxonomy (on the CUTLA web site) to describe
