On June and , , in the midst of the Zoot Suit Riots, Los Angeles news-papers announced the arrest of a "pachuco woman" According to the press, twenty-two-year-old Amelia Venegas, mother of a toddler and wife of a sailor, had incited violence by urging a gang of pachucos to attack sheriff's deputies

The Zoot Suit Riots of 1943 provide an historic example of deviance for which multiple sociological theories apply A counterculture emerged during the 1930s and 1940s that included new music, dancing, and dress- the zoot suit Mexican American youth in Los Angeles and African American youth in New York City adopted the ostentatious zoot style
